## *Examiners Advisory Board*

The Examiners Advisory Board (EAB) has continued to meet twice a year in its ongoing responsibility to oversee the Calisthenic Skills Programme. The aim of the Examiners Advisory Board is to enhance the Development of Calisthenics through the implementation and evaluation of the National Calisthenic Exam programme.

The development of the updated video and music CD has continued to occupy a great deal of the EAB members time and take enormous effort to finally arrive at a product which is almost ready for production. However, copyright laws have bought the project to a complete standstill as the ACF works through its lawyer to determine appropriate licencing agreements. At this point in time a release date cannot be set until this issue is resolved. In response to queries from state and territories and to maintain national uniformity the following guidelines have now been introduced :

- Deferral of an exam is only possible with a medical certificate. 50% of the fee will be deferred the candidate to incur 50% of the fee to resit at a later date.
- Refunds are not available for withdrawals or non appearance at an exam as hall bookings and Examiners must still be paid.
- Medical certificates are not to be presented to the Examiner on the day. If a candidate has an injury or illness they will not be examined.

- There is provision in the *conduct of an exam* for candidates with special needs but the exam requirements remain unchanged. e.g a hearing impaired candidate who requires the volume to be turned up on the accompanying music. Examiners, however, need to be notified well ahead of the exam.
- Candidates must resit a level for which they are Unable to Qualify before progressing to the next level.
- Although not compulsory, candidates are encouraged to complete all levels.

At this point in time mention must be made of the tremendous efforts of Barbara Prizrenac (SA) and Diane Synott (VIC) who have resigned from examining and the EAB due to other commitments. Both Barbara and Diane are to be commended for their initial development of the Calisthenic Examination System in the early 1980's and their ongoing commitment to the programme to ensure the establishment of the EAB. Best wishes to Barbara and Diane as they now follow other pursuits.

A warm welcome is extended to Jan Rogers(Vic) and Glenys Anderson (SA) who now join the EAB as the next qualified and experienced Examiners in those states.
